He gave workshops in his school district to fellow teachers on professional days for many years. Ray has been retired from teaching for the past eight years, and this has allowed him to devote more time to the promotion of his favorite activity and to learn higher-level round dances with Christine.

Ray is well known for his teaching ability in the square dance community. He loves to create interesting material for the dance community, and enjoys performing on stage. 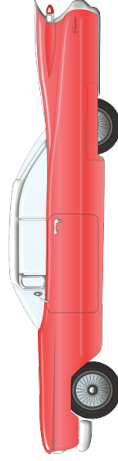
JL AND LINDA PELTON CUER DALLAS, TX

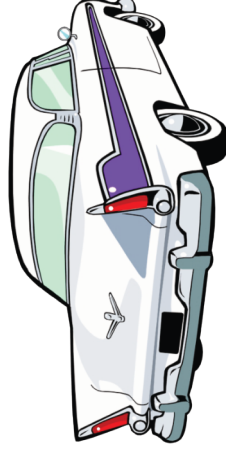

Being homeschooled, Andrew took his first clogging class as a fun alternative to physical education, but little did he know that he would fall in love with the dance form and pursue a career teaching clogging at workshops and conventions that would span the entire globe. Since that time, Andrew has taught at numerous regional, national, and international workshops and conventions throughout the United States, Canada, and Australia. His clogging group, the Drew Crew Cloggers, has been active since 2009 and is composed of roughly 25 people. Andrew is also a proud board member of the Western New York Cloggers Association (WNYCA), which is an organization responsible for putting on multiple annual clogging events including the famous Nickel City Clogging Festival in Buffalo, NY. 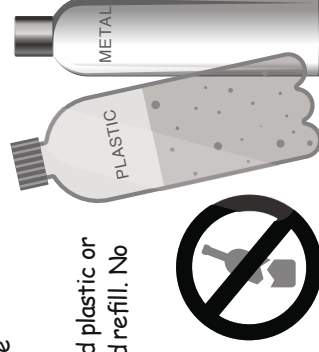
